## **Match/Shooting Schedule**

### **PRACTICE – 12 pm, Friday, August 13th**

Site in range is open for registered competitors.

#### **For All Matches**

Timers may be used in order to keep the match progressing at an acceptable rate. Competitors are allowed 5 minutes to make 4 shots. All targets will be visible from all shooting positions. Air, snacks, water, sunscreen, and bug spray will be available at the rest area during the match.

### **PISTOL FIELD TARGET MATCH – 3:30pm, Friday, August 13th**

This will be a 40 shot course, 10 lanes, two targets per lane, and two shots per target. There will be 1 designated standing lane.

### **RIFLE FIELD TARGET MATCH – Day 1 – Saturday August 14th**

Competitors can start sight in practice for the Rifle Field Target match at 8:00am. Safety Meeting begins at 9:00am. The match starts at 9:30am. This will be a 60 shot course, 15 lanes, two targets per lane, and two shots per target. There will be 2 designated forced position lanes.

### **RIFLE FIELD TARGET MATCH – Day 2 – Sunday, August 15th**

Competitors can start sight in practice for the Rifle Field Target match at 7:30am. Safety Meeting begins at 8:15am. The match starts at 8:30am. This will be a 60 shot course, 15 lanes, two targets per lane, and two shots per target. There will be 1 designated standing lane.

#### **Match Rules**

AAFTA rules and classes apply. WFTF rules apply to the WFTF Class.

Equipment inspection and FPE testing may be done at the Match Director's discretion. In any matters arising and not covered by these rules, the Match Director's decision will be final.

#### **Target Malfunctions:**

Targets will be checked each morning before the match with a WFTF calibrated target tester.

If a reset string breaks, snags, or a target cannot be reset, call a marshal to repair it.

Any disputed target must be challenged immediately after a shot is fired. Under no circumstances should the shooter touch the reset cord until the dispute has been resolved. Targets should be checked by a Course Marshal whose decision is final.

Marshal procedures to validate a target dispute:

1. The first thing to do is a visual check-up.
  - a. Make sure the shooter hasn't touched the reset string.
  - b. Check that the reset string isn't stuck or in tension preventing the target to fall.
  - c. Check that the target inclination is appropriate.
  - d. Check that the target is properly secured
  - e. Check that there isn't anything in the surroundings of the target that prevents the target to work correctly (bush, tree, branch etc.).
  - f. If the dispute is at the beginning of a session, validate splits;
2. After passing all of the visual checks, the target will be tested at least 2 times in different kill zone target areas (ex. Top and bottom) using the Official WFTF target checking device by a marshal trained and certified in its use.
3. If no issue is identified, the shooter will have a zero (miss).
4. If a target is found to be faulty, the target should be repaired or replaced immediately by a target with similar kill-zone size and will be re-shot by only the shooter who had challenged the shot.
5. If a target is found to be faulty and there's no replacement target, the target will be removed from the match and any points awarded prior to removal from the match will not be counted.

## Meal/Activity Schedule

### **11am, Friday, August 13th**

Gate is open for early arrivals. Competitors must sign in upon arrival. Competitors may setup their camp site.

### **7pm-9pm, Friday, August 13th**

The sponsoring West Coast clubs will be hosting a cook out at the clubhouse on Friday evening at approximately 7pm. Hamburgers, sausages, chips and beverages. Cook your own burger!

### **1pm-2pm, Saturday, August 14th**

Lunch will be served at the clubhouse following the rifle match. Sandwiches, chips, soft drinks.

### **12:30-1:30pm, Sunday, August 15th**

Lunch will be served at the clubhouse following the rifle match. Sandwiches, chips, soft drinks.

### **1:30pm-2pm, Sunday, August 15th**

Awards presentation.

Any AAFTA Class that has less than three competitors preregistered will be consolidated with another class.

Depth of awards per class:

1st Place award – 3 or more preregistered in the Class

2nd Place award – 5 or more preregistered in the Class

3rd Place award – 7 or more preregistered in the Class

4th Place award – 10 or more preregistered in the Class

5th Place award – 13 or more preregistered in the Class

Besides the available free camping at the range, there are nearby campgrounds and numerous motels and hotels in Morro Bay (5 miles) and San Luis Obispo (10 miles).

Directions:

Use your phone/GPS to find the Hogue Action Pistol Range in San Luis Obispo. As you enter the range stay to the right and follow the gravel road out to the Field Target area.
